

WELSH TERRIER ASSOCIATION JUDGING LIST CRITERIA 2022

Judges will be accepted onto the above judging lists provided that they can satisfy the committee that the following criteria have been met:

A1 LIST

To have been approved by the Kennel Club to award Challenge Certificates in the breed and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.

A2 LIST

For persons who fulfil all the requirements of the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with the Kennel Club requirements and accepted by them for inclusion on the A2 List and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.

A3 LIST BREED SPECIALIST

1. Minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have judged at one breed club show and/or one breed club supported entry shows.
3. To have judged the breed at three open shows or Championship Shows without CCs with an adequate Geographical Spread.
4. To have judged a minimum of twenty classes.
5. To have judged a minimum of thirty dogs.
6. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures.
7. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club accredited trainer on Confirmation and Movement.
8. To have passed a Points of the Dog Assessment with a Kennel Club accredited trainer.
9. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an assessment.
10. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of three dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club stud book.
11. To have stewarded at twelve shows.

A3 LIST NON BREED SPECIALIST

1. Minimum of 7 years judging experience in any one breed (to include five years in his breed) and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have judged at one breed club show and/or one breed club supported entry shows.
3. To have judged the breed at three open shows or Championship Shows without CCs with an adequate Geographical Spread.
4. To have judged a minimum of twenty classes.
5. To have judged a minimum of thirty dogs.
6. To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed.
9. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an assessment.

B LIST BREED SPECIALIST

1. To have five years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have judged this breed at at least one Open Show.
3. To have judged six dogs of this breed.
4. To have attended one breed specific judging seminar and passed an assessment or have attended a BAD and passed the MCE.

B LIST NON BREED SPECIALIST

1. To have seven years experience owning and exhibiting in any one breed and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.

2. To have judged this breed at at least one Open Show.
3. To have judged six dogs of this breed.
4. To have attended one breed specific judging seminar and passed an assessment or have attended a BAD and passed the MCE.

C LIST

1. To have shown an interest lasting at least five years in the breed and/or breeding and showing a pedigree dog and to have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have attended a Kennel Club Requirements of a Dog Show Judge seminar (but not necessarily taken or passed the exam)
3. To have attended a Kennel Club Confirmation and Movement seminar.
4. To have stewarded for at least two days.
