

Criteria for Inclusion on Judging Lists

Judges will be accepted onto the above judging lists provided that they can satisfy the Committee that the following criteria have been met:

A1 List To have been approved by The Kennel Club to award Challenge Certificates in the breed and have the support of The Welsh Terrier Association.

A2 List For persons who fulfill all the requirements of the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and accepted by them for inclusion on the A2 list and have the support of The Welsh Terrier Association.

A3 List (Breed Specialist)

1. Minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed, and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have judged at one breed club show and/or three breed club supported entry shows
3. To have judged the breed at 3 open shows or Championship Shows without CCs with an adequate Geographical Spread.
4. To have judged a minimum of (20) classes
5. To have judged a minimum of (30) dogs
6. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures
7. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer, on Conformation and Movement.
8. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an Examination and/or assessment where applicable.
9. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of (3) dogs when they obtained their 1st entry in The Kennel Club Stud Book.
10. To have stewarded at (12) shows.

A3 List (Non Breed Specialist)

1. A minimum of 7 years judging experience in any one breed (to include 5 years in this breed) and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have judged the breed at 3 Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs with an adequate geographical spread.
3. To have judged a minimum of (25) classes in this breed
4. To have judged (50) dogs in this breed
5. To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed
6. To have attended at least (1) breed specific judging seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable
7. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of (3) dogs of any breed when they obtained their 1st entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book

B List (Breed Specialists)

1. To have 5 years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed and have the support of the Welsh Terrier Association
2. To have judged (5) classes of this breed at Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs
3. To have judged (10) dogs of this breed
4. To have attended one breed specific judging seminar and passed an assessment where applicable

B List (Non Specialists)

1. To have 7 years judging experience in any one breed and have the support of The Welsh Terrier Association.
2. To have judged (8) classes of this breed at Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs

3.To have judged (15) dogs of this breed

4.To have attended one breed specific judging seminar and passed an assessment where applicable

C List (Breed Specialists)

For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of Welsh Terrier Association. Listings would normally include persons who have judged the breed at Limited and Open shows but do not yet qualify for the B Lists.

C List (non specialists)

For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of The Welsh Terrier Association. Listings would normally include persons who have judged the breed at Limited and Open Shows but do not yet qualify for the B Lists.
